Profiles of organisations and experts

APRE – Italian Agency for the Promotion of European Research

<u>APRE</u> is the Italian Agency for the Promotion of European Research, supporting national stakeholders in engaging with EU research and innovation programmes. Acting as the National Contact Point for the Horizon Europe Framework Programme, APRE provides information, training, and advisory services to enhance participation in Horizon Europe.

The Czech Technical University in Prague (CTU)

Founded in 1707, the <u>Czech Technical University in Prague (CTU)</u> is one of the oldest and largest technical universities in Europe. It comprises eight faculties with more than 18,000 students and offers 170 accredited study programmes, including 53 taught in foreign languages. CTU is recognised for its strong research base and international collaboration across engineering, technology, and applied sciences.

The Czech Institute of Informatics, Robotics and Cybernetics (CIIRC CTU)

Established in 2013, the <u>Czech Institute of Informatics</u>, <u>Robotics and Cybernetics (CIIRC CTU)</u> is a research institute of the Czech Technical University in Prague.
